



## Overview of GLP-1 RA and GIP/GLP-1 RA medications

You have been prescribed or expressed interest in a class of injectable medications used in the treatment of obesity, weight management or weight-related medical problems.

These medications work by increasing the level of 1 or 2 satiety hormones naturally produced in the body. The specific hormones are GLP-1 and GIP.

**GLP-1: glucagon like peptide 1**

**GIP: gastric inhibitory polypeptide**

Ozempic	Semaglutide	Once <b>weekly</b> subcutaneous injection	Type 2 diabetes <b>Off label for wt loss</b>
Saxenda	Liraglutide	Once <b>daily</b> subcutaneous injection	Obesity, Weight-related medical problems
Zepbound	Tirzepatide	Once <b>weekly</b> subcutaneous injection	Overweight, Obesity, Weight-related medical problems
Mounjaro	Tirzepatide	Once <b>weekly</b> subcutaneous injection	Type 2 diabetes <b>Off label for wt loss</b>
